

Voluntary Work to be undertaken with age range: Volunteer Youth Minister

Workers with children and/or adults must have a commitment to:

- Treat individuals with respect;
- Recognise and respect their abilities and potential for development;
- Promote their rights to make their own decisions and choices, unless it is unsafe;
- Ensure their welfare and safety;
- The promotion of social justice, social responsibility and respect for others; and
- Confidentiality, never passing on personal information, except to the person to whom you are responsible, unless there are safeguarding issues of concern (e.g. allegations of abuse). Safeguarding issues of concern must **always** be reported to the Police or Social Care services and Diocesan Safeguarding Adviser.

(Occasionally) • Leading a small group. (Occasionally) • To work in accordance with St George's Church Policies on Safeguarding, health & safety and data privacy, and follow relevant risk assessments. <p><i>As a volunteer working regularly with people who are/may be vulnerable, this post may be eligible for a criminal record check which will be renewed at least every five years.</i></p> <p>DBS Clearance Required: Yes.</p> <p>Type of DBS (Enhanced): Child Workforce, no R.A.</p>
